Council Member Paige Ellis joined the meeting following the vote.

6. Discussion on Amendment Cycle for TxDOT's Unified Transportation Program (UTP)

The Chair recognized Ms. Heather Ashley-Nguyen, P.E. who provided a detailed overview of TxDOT's UTP. Ms. Ashley-Nguyen reminded the Board that the UTP is a baseline forecast of the potential revenue that may be available for the next 10 (ten) years. The Board was informed that the UTP is a 10-year document that guides the development of statewide transportation projects, determines how much transportation funding the State expects to have over the next decade, and how to distribute it. The Board was also informed that the UTP includes all transportation projects that TxDOT is developing for construction over the next 10 years.

Ms. Ashley-Nguyen noted that there can be out of cycle amendments to the UTP but TxDOT typically does not process out of cycle amendments. The UTP development timeline was later highlighted and discussed. Ms. Ashley-Nguyen informed the Board that additional funding is anticipated as a result of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and concluded the presentation by directing the Board to the TxDOT website for additional information on the UTP and the Project Tracker for review all of the stages of project development.

Mr. Tucker Ferguson, P.E., TxDOT Austin District Engineer later informed board members that a copy of the UTP will be available for review at the conclusion of the meeting.

Judge Andy Brown and Commissioner Edward Theriot (Proxy for Commissioner Clara Beckett) joined the meeting.

7. Update on Federal Infrastructure Bill

The Chair recognized Mr. Ashby Johnson, CAMPO Executive Director who provided an overview of the Federal Infrastructure bill that was passed late last year. Mr. Johnson referred to the summary included in the meeting materials during the update.

Mr. Johnson informed the Board that the Texas funding apportionment totals presented were for the state and not for the region. Mr. Johnson reported that he is still waiting to receive apportionment funding amounts for this region which will be in the form of Category 7 funding. Mr. Johnson also requested input and direction from the Transportation Policy Board on how to handle the Discretionary Grant Program portion of the Federal infrastructure bill. Mr. Johnson added that the Technical Advisory Committee will also be having discussions on how to handle the Discretionary Grant Program portion of the Federal infrastructure bill through February to bring recommendations to the Transportation Policy Board in March or April on how to proceed.

- a. Spring Amendment Cycle for the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Due to audio difficulties, a report was not provided on the Spring Amendment Cycle for the 2045 RTP and 2021-2024 TIP. Mr. Johnson informed the Board that staff will soon launch the spring amendment cycle for the 2045 RTP and 2021-2024 TIP and added that additional information will be provided to the Board in a follow-up email.

b. Update on TxDOT Safety Work Group

Mr. Johnson reported that members of the TxDOT Safety Work Group include Texas Transportation Commissioners Laura Ryan and Alvin New as well as the metropolitan transportation planning organization directors of the five largest regions in the state. Mr. Johnson informed the Board that one (1) work group meeting was held and the topics of discussion were the crash experience in Texas and how to reduce the number of crashes over time. Mr. Johnson also summarized his comments offered during the discussions. The work group is scheduled to meet again in January.
